KING'S MANSION, GOA

If you can't decide between Western medicine and ancient Ayurveda, this palatial 17-suite property on the shores of northern Goa brings balance. Guests undergo pre-arrival genomics testing (in labs in their country of origin) with the results sent on ahead so that an individualised programme within one of five packages (such as detox or revitalisation) can be created. RUSH CREEK LODGE, YOSEMITE, USA

Don't go chasing waterfalls – let them come to you at Yosemite's Rush Creek Lodge. The 5,000sqft spa features its own indoor waterfall and river rock beds to recreate the rushing waters, granite formations and wellbeing boost of the National Park in which the resort sits. Try Boga yoga done on a stand-up paddle board tethered to the side of a 2,400sqft heated saltwater pool – or simply forest bathe in the region's revitalising O2. rushcreeklodge.com

EMILIA ROMAGNA, ITALY

Gastronomes will already be familiar with Bologna's pasta, Modena's balsamic and Parma's ham, but this less-trodden region in northern Italy is also something of a cultural hotspot. The coastal party town of Rimini recently welcomed PART, a new contemporary art museum in a pair of restored buildings. The distinctive red façade of this 11-room palazzo is even more striking given the dazzling whitewashed city of Ostuni forms its backdrop. Fireplaces, stone vaults and frescoed ceilings date from the 17th century, while antiques have been sourced from across the world. Want a memento to take home? You can buy some of the furniture. The Fife Arms, Aberdeenshire

Described by many as the hottest hotel in Scotland, The Fife Arms is unmissable. Head to the Cairngorms National Park and marvel at original paintings and commissioned installations throughout the hotel, including a Lucian Freud in the lobby, a Picasso in the drawing room and a Brueghel in the Clunie dining room (which serves the best food for miles). The hotel is a treasure trove of art and taxidermy arranged in Victoriana splendour, courtesy of interior designer Russell Sage. Ask for the 'Artist's Studio' bedroom. thefifearms.com



Oslo

Oslo is a great weekend getaway for contemporary art, with incredible collections within a short cab ride of each other. Head uphill to the Ekbergparken for a panoramic view over the city (a great way to get your bearings). Visit the James Turrell sky room or walk the sculpture trail to see works by Roni Horn, Louise Bourgeois, Tony Oursler and Damien Hirst, before hitting the new Edvard Munch Museum. Northern Spain

A long weekend on the coast here offers the perfect mix of art, architecture and good food. Shanghai

Shanghai has an abundance of contemporary art. Menorca

Nowhere's better off season than Menorca. The crowds have left, and the sea is still warm. Visit the Mercat de Peix in Mahón to grab the freshest shellfish and a loaf of bread, then drive to a deserted beach near Es Grau for a bonfire and lots of local Binifadet wine. Florence



Porto

Porto has attracted oenophiles for centuries, but World of Wine offers a compelling new reason to visit. The ambitious project – housed in renovated port cellars in Vila Nova de Gaia – offers six 'experiences' and nine cafés, bars and restaurants, including the upscale 1828 restaurant and the supremely well-stocked Angel's Share wine bar. wow.pt


New York

Few chefs have CVs as stellar as Aussie-born Shaun Hergatt: two Michelin stars at SHO, then another star at Juni, as well as a clutch of best chef awards. His new SoHo joint, Vestry, offers a fish and vegetable-based menu with Japanese accents – red beets with preserved plum, smoked scallop with avocado and yuzu – plated in painterly style. vestrynyc.com



| ↓ | HOLKHAM, NORFOLK, UK

Holkham has ambitions to be 'the UK's most pioneering and sustainable rural estate'. In 2012, it resumed control of the 10,000 nature reserve and has already increased biodiversity and bird populations by 50 per cent. Its popular Victoria Inn, located at the gates to the main Palladian hall, not far from the sandy beach, sources ingredients either from the estate or within a 50-mile radius. Estate vehicles are electrified and guests, who stay in unique lodges, are encouraged to record wildlife spots in a nature diary. holkham.co.uk



With Snøhetta's portfolio already covering Europe's first underwater restaurant (fittingly called Under), Oslo's Opera House, whose walkable exterior seems to rise from the water, and Norway's new banknotes, it's unsurprising that the Norwegian architect's latest project is another astonishing concept. Set to open in 2022 in a remote northern area, Svart ('black'), hopes to become the world's first hotel to create more energy than it uses, aiming to go off-grid within five years. Resembling the lair of a Bond villain, the glass-fronted wooden structure looks to local building traditions for design inspiration and will have uninterrupted views over the nearby Svartisen glacier. An awareness and care for nature is entrenched in the Norwegian psyche, and this will be reflected throughout the hotel – its sustainable farm will supply ingredients for the four restaurants, an indoor-outdoor spa will use locally-grown herbs and marine ingredients and includes a sound-healing studio, and water transfers will be made via electric boats. Both day and overnight guests at the 99 rooms can sign up to a programme that makes the most of the remote surroundings - yoga in the midnight sun, diving, foraging, glacier ice-climbing. Opening rates are yet to be revealed but you can expect them to be high. svart.no
